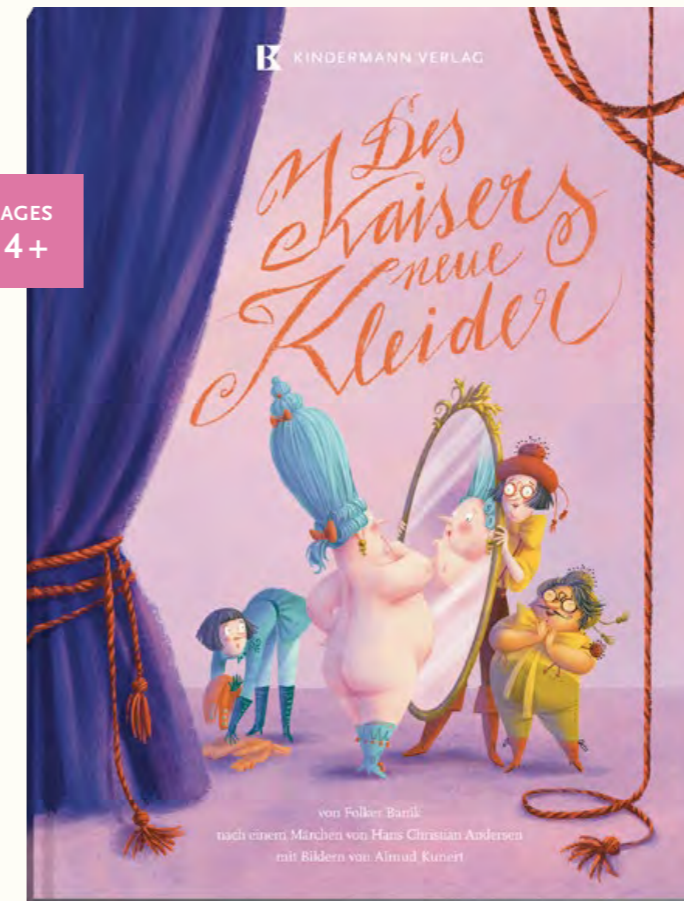

It's Him – The Most Beautiful Spring Poems

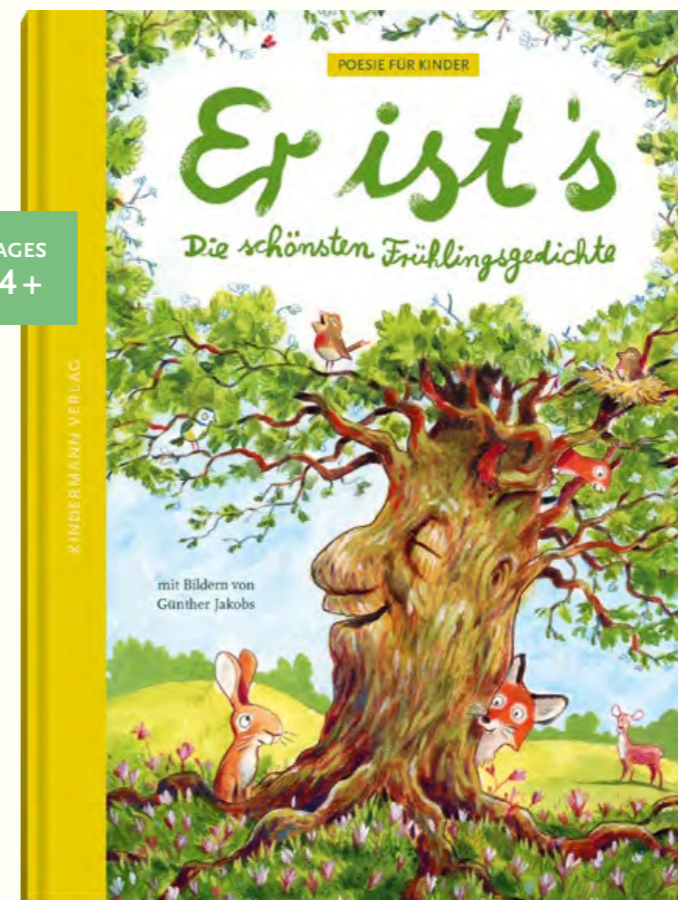

Marie Curie – a Woman Changes the World

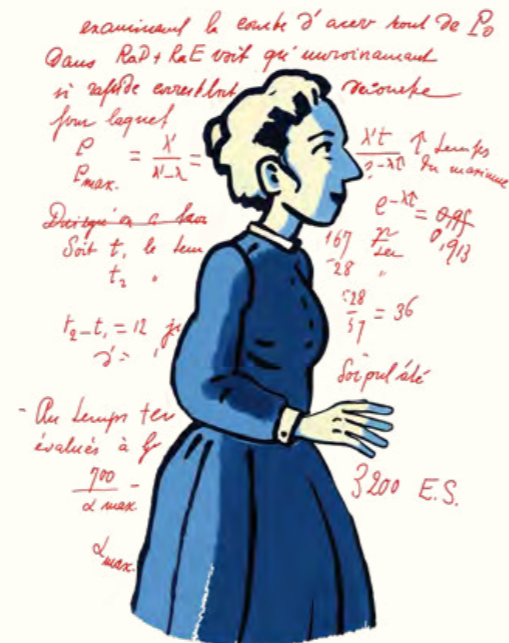

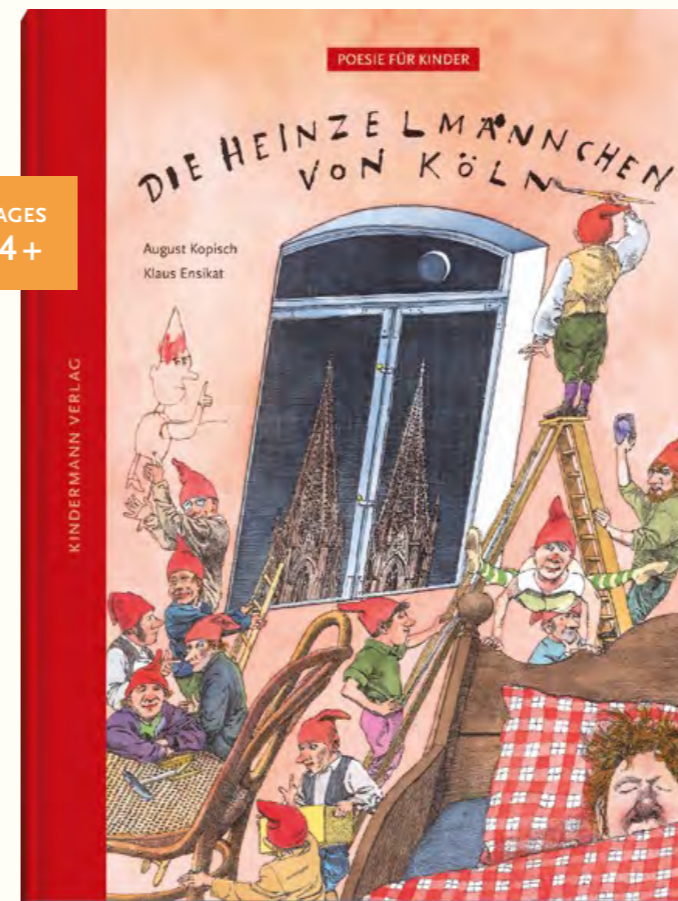

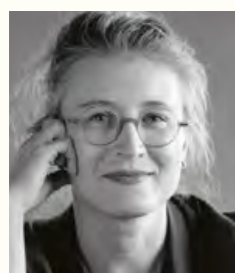
A Picture Book about Tolerance, Diversity and Love

Sandra Brandstätter, born in Salzburg in 1980, studied multimedia art at the FH Salzburg. She lives and works in Berlin as an illustrator, comic author and character designer for animated films and series. »L for Love« already is her second children's book project together with Martin Baltscheit.

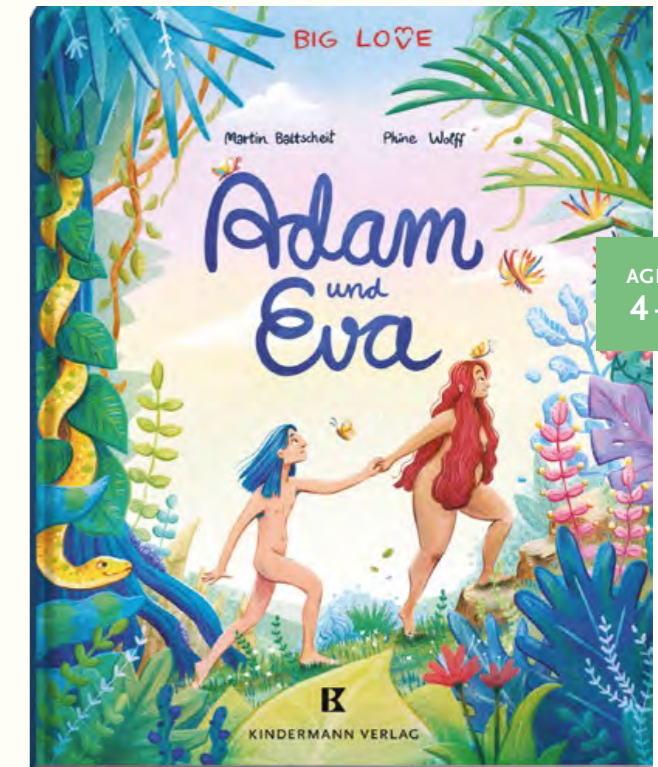

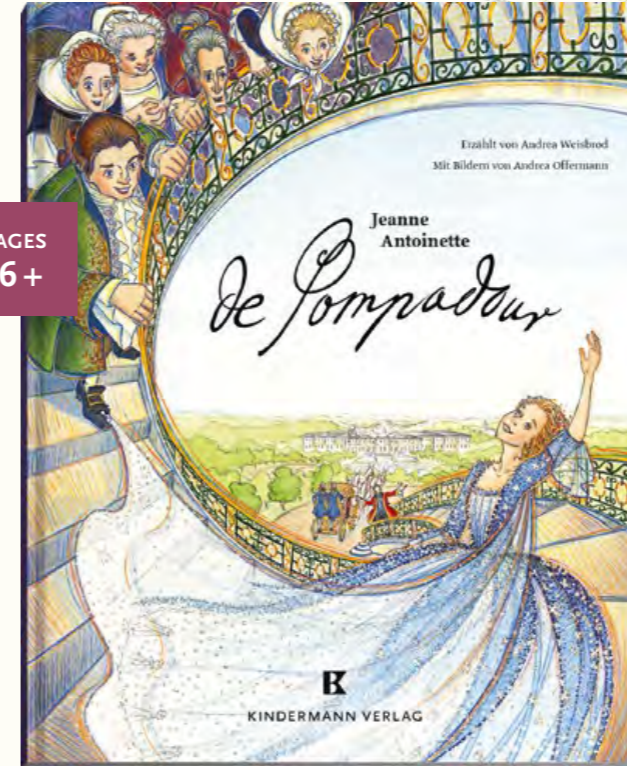

As a freelance author and teacher for the German language, she and her husband, their two daughters, and the family-poodle since then find inspiration in this dynamic city.



Andrea Offermann, born in 1980 in Cologne, studied Illustration, Animation, and Printmaking in Los Angeles, Hamburg, and Florence. Since, she mostly works freelance for children's book publishers as well as young adult's book publishers. Her works were repeatedly honoured, including the »Preis der Jugendjury« (Youth Jury Award) of the Austrian Youth Book Award and the »Portfolio Grand Prize« of the Society of Children's Book Writers and Illustrators.
